My dear Chancellor;-

After making an investigation of the work done by the military company in the University of Kansas, I submit the following report.

First, The amount of work required of the men is that they shall attend drill at least twice per month in order to draw their pay.

Second. The work is educational, rather than hygeinic, consisting of manouvers, and manual of arms, neither of which give the vigorous exercise which is essential for health.

Third. Their work does not demand a bath at the close of their exercise, thus missing one of the best features of gymnastic or atheletic work.

Fourth. Their officers are students and are not responsible to the University. All our coaches and instructors in gymnastics and atheletics are now employed by the University.

Fifth. The work is not sufficient to give full credit in any one term, and partial credit would distroy the efficiency of the teaching in our regular class work. e.g. giving credit for one day out of three as has been suggested.
