Mayor of Lawrence

Acting under that immediate authority my first act was to obtain the right to donate whatever claim the Episcopal Church had to the property on Mt Oread, for the use of the State University. This was executed Next to obtain from the Mayor and City-Council of Lawrence all their claims for securing the same purpose. - This was also accomplished The Conditions however agreed to between your Ex Com' and the City Council and Mayor of Lawrence are as follows - viz,

First, - That the present building should be ready for the reception of pupils in January A. D. 1867.

Second, - That the Orphans of Lawrence made so by the Quantrell Raid as also the Orphans of all Loyal Soldiers of Kansas made so in the late war should be admitted free. - The Conditions were accepted and may now be regarded <sup>as</sup> the law of the Institution, unless your disapproval should make it otherwise - Your subscriber would

therefore solicit your early attention to this subject so that a definite understanding may be had for all time to come.

Our next official act was to procure a Deed of Transfer of  $2\frac{3}{4}$  acres of land necessary to complete the square of A Lane around the university buildings from the late Hon' Jas' A Lane.

This after some delay he agreed to sell me at One Hundred Dollars pr Acre, taking my own individual obligation at 364 days for the purchase, and the Deed has been regularly executed and recorded Subsequently Mr Lane was pleased to pass
