On motion of P. McBreen it was voted that

inson, Gordon Grover, Mayor of the City of Lawrence,
and the Chancellor

C. B. Jones as chairman of a committee ap-
pointed at last meeting reported the following paper
which was adopted:

Bonds
Resolution

Whereas - The city of Lawrence in its corporate capacity, in response to a survey poll vote
of its citizens in a legal election called and held for that purpose, has donated to the state of Kansas the very liberal sum of 100,000 \$ in bonds of
the city, for the purpose of aiding in the construction of permanent buildings for the State University, therefore Resolved, that as representatives of the
state for the time being in the management of this institution, and speaking also as we believe the sentiments of the friends of education throughout our
Commonwealth, we desire to indicate, in some significant way manner, our high appreciation of this munificent gift. Resolved,
that while we cannot do more, we certainly cannot do less content ourselves with doing less than to express our most hearty thanks
to the citizens of Lawrence for their extraordinary liberality in the donation referred to, and our confident belief that they will ultimately find ample
reward in the most satisfactory results to them and the state. Resolved, that the foregoing preamble and resolutions be spread
upon the records of this board, a certified copy thereof furnished to the Mayor of the city to be by him presented to the city Council, and
a like copy be furnished the city printers for publication.

On motion of P. McBreen the Executive Com-
missioner was empowered to employ an instructor in
vocal music for the University.
