## Special Meeting

A meeting of the Regents of the University of Kansas, duly called, was held at the Eldridge House in Lawrence, March 26th, 1872, at 3 o'clock, p.m.

Members present - The Chancellor and Regents, Vail, Robinson, Elliott, Lones, Giles, Mitchell, Keare, Halderman and Tenney.

Prayer was offered by Rev. Dr. Keare.

In the absence of the Secretary, Wm. C. Tenney was chosen secy. pro. tem.

The Chancellor after calling Regent Vail to the chair presented a verbal report of his recent visit to the East made for the purpose of securing the finishing and heating the new University building in the best manner. The following recommendations were made by the Chancellor and unanimously adopted by the Board.

1. That time be communicated from a standard clock to the several rooms in the building by means of electricity.
2. That the gas-jets in the large hall be ignited by electricity.
3. That the principle of the parabolic curve be applied in constructing the floors of the large hall and the four lecture rooms devoted to scientific experiments.

4. That the building be heated and ventilated by steam, the rooms in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd stories to be heated by indirect radiation, i.e. by means of coils of pipe placed in the basement near the openings of the flues leading
