Jan 30 in Experimental Chemistry, Physics & Mechanics should
 special be divided between two professors, one to have charge of
 Metallurgy Experimental Physics and Mechanics, the other to have
 charge of Experimental Chemistry; the division of
 the work to take effect at the beginning of the academic
 year in September next. This arrangement, which
 is absolutely necessary thorough instruction in the
 important branches named above, involves the
 employment of an additional professor, for whose
 salary from September 1st to Dec. 31st 1873, the
 requisite sum is included in the estimate of ap-
 propriations hereunto submitted.

Cabinet Collection

Over three thousand five hundred speci-
 mens have been added, during the past year, to
 the Cabinet collections in Botany, Zoology and
 Geology, chiefly through the diligence of Prof.
 Snow and of students in his Department.

Through the liberality of the Patent Office,
 Washington, D. C., one hundred and thirty ^{working} models
 have been added to the collection of apparatus in the
 Department of Mechanics.
