

on personal conference with members of the Faculty, upon conversations with intelligent Citizens whose opinions were apparently unbiassed, and upon observation of the work done in the University as seen by the annual examinations, It has been found necessary in some instances to balance opinion by opinion; and whatever recommendations will be made the Board will consider to be not perhaps the best but the most practicable.

It is the pleasant duty of your Committee to say, that upon the whole the testimony is that the University is doing good work - as good as could be expected. The ~~the~~ building itself stands as a monument of the labors & aspirations of those who have been concerned in laying the foundations of the U. of C.
